

**PROTOCOL**  
**of the meeting of the Joint Commission on international road transport of passengers  
and goods**  
**between the delegations of**  
**Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Slovak Republic**  
**held in Sarajevo on 19 November 2019**

The delegations agreed the following agenda:

- Ad 1. Exchange of statistical data regarding the transport of passengers and goods;
- Ad 2. Transport of passengers;
- Ad 3. Transport of goods;
- Ad 4. Miscellaneous

The list of members of both delegations is attached to this Protocol.

At the opening of the meeting, after the welcome address, the heads of delegations introduced the members of their respective delegations. Both delegations noted that the Agreement between Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Slovak Republic on passenger and goods transport by road signed in Bratislava on 24 January 2012, and entered into force on January 2013.

***Ad 1. Exchange of statistical data regarding the transport of passengers and goods***

Both delegations presented their respective statistical data showing a rise in trade exchanges between Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Slovak Republic.

***Ad 2. Transport of passengers***

A new regular bus service which will connect Sarajevo and Bratislava with final destination in the Federal Republic of Germany is expected to be operational as of December 2019. The Delegation of Bosnia and Herzegovina asked about transport of passengers between bus stations located in different countries. The Delegation of the Slovak Republic answered that the regular bus services are operated in accordance with terms and conditions of the issued permit, and there are no additional terms and conditions.

Both Delegations agreed that non-regular transport of passengers is excluded from permit requirement. Occasional transport of passengers is performed under the Interbus Agreement. Control document according to Article 5 of the Agreement between Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Slovak Republic on passenger and goods transport by road is the Interbus waybill.



### ***Ad 3. Transport of goods***

Both delegations noted that transport of goods is carried out without any obstacles.

The delegations agreed that the number of permits to/from third countries is 250, as of 1 January 2020. The permits will be valid until 31 January next year. Both delegations agreed to consider, if necessary, eventual allocation of additional permits to/from third countries, upon request. As regards the use of permits to/from third countries, the Delegations agreed that one permit is valid for two laden runs to/from third countries without any time limitations, and for the period of validity of the permit. Entry/exit run performed by empty vehicle require no permit.

### ***Ad 4. Miscellaneous***

Delegation of Bosnia and Herzegovina informed the Delegation of the Slovak Republic about a web portal [www.transportnedozvole.gov.ba](http://www.transportnedozvole.gov.ba) providing all relevant information about licences, permits, registered carriers and drivers in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The Delegation of the Slovak Republic informed the Delegation of Bosnia and Herzegovina about a web portal [www.jiscd.sk](http://www.jiscd.sk) providing information about licences, transport operators and drivers in the Republic of Slovakia.
