

PROTOCOL

Of the meeting between the delegation of the Ministry of Transports of Romania and the delegation of Ministry of Civil Affairs and Communication from Bosnia-Herzegovina

Further to the invitation of the Romanian Ministry of Transports a meeting between a delegation of the Ministry of Transports of Romania and a delegation of the Ministry of Civil Affairs and Communications of Bosnia-Herzegovina took place in Bucharest, on 28-29 of October 1998.

The two delegations met to discuss issues related to the co-operation between the two countries in the field of road transport.

The two delegations were:

Both delegations agreed that now exists the opportunity to enlarge the bilateral cooperation in the field of road transports taking in consideration the future development of industry and trade between our countries.

The two parties agreed that the quota of permits must be settled down taking into consideration the level of bilateral commercial exchanges.

The Bosnia-Herzegovina's delegation confirmed to the Romanian delegation that the Bosnia-Herzegovina is the successor of the FSR Yugoslavia concerning the road transport Agreement until a new bilateral Agreement will enter into force. Taking into considerations the provisions of the Agreement between the PR of Romania and the FSR Yugoslavia signed at 25 December 1963, the two parties agreed to perform on bilateral exchange of permits as follows:

- 200 universal (bilateral, transit and third countries) permits with payment of road user charges valid until 31 January 1999.

The Romanian Embassy in Sarajevo is authorised by the Romanian Ministry of Transport to deliver the Romanian permits to the Ministry for Civil Affairs and Communications from Bosnia-Herzegovina. The Ministry for Civil Affairs and Communications from Bosnia-Herzegovina will deliver the permits to the Romanian Embassy also.

The preliminary quota of permits for the year 1999 will be 1000 permits.

The permits will valid until the 31 of January next year.

500 of permits with payment of the 1999 quota will be delivered until the 31 November 1998.

Both parties will consider with goodwill any demand for supplementary permits.

Both delegations underlined that there are no applications from the carriers to establish passengers regular lines. The other passenger transport will be performed as stipulated in the Agreement between the PR of Romania and the FSR Yugoslavia signed at 25 December 1963, Chapter I, Article 6.

The Bosnia-Herzegovina's delegation informed the Romanian delegation about the possibility to establish several regular passenger lines to Turkey which will transit Romania. Both delegations agreed that any application for a regular passenger line will be solved as quickly as possible if all the formalities for the destination and departure countries were accomplished.

Concerning the text of the new road Agreement (in annex) the delegations agreed the draft without observations. The Agreement was initialed by both sides.

Both delegations informed about the regulations in force in their countries concerning the road transport, the taxes levied and the maximal admissible weights.

The Bosnia-Herzegovina's delegation asks the Romanian delegation to support the authorised institut of Bosnia-Herzegovina to obtain the approval of IRU Organisation to use the TIR carnets. The Bosnia-Herzegovina delegation confirms that their country signed the TIR Convention. The Romanian delegation agreed to support the Bosnia-Herzegovina, started with the 50 years IRU Celebration.

The Bosnia-Herzegovina delegation invited the Romanian delegation at Sarajevo, for the next Joint Commission of road transport. The Romanian delegation was pleased to accept the invitation.
